EURAG meets in Lithuania, next time in Moscow



EURAG's biannual council meeting took place in Vilnius, Lithuania, in May. The main topic concentrated on how to reduce social exclusion of older persons in today's society. There was also a lively debate on the road ahead for this, the oldest federation of senior associations in Europe (+150 associations in 32 countries). The next council meeting will be hosted by the Russian Pensioners' Union, a 1,750,000 member organization and it will take place September 18-22. The main theme will be lifelong learning.

Ingrid Eyers, from Nurse to PhD Research Older Adult Care



Ingrid was born in England and spent part of her childhood in South Africa and her youth in Germany. Ingrid is a semi-retired gerontologist. She works as an independent expert in England and Germany, and travels widely. Initially qualified in nursing, she worked in intensive care before deciding to focus on the care of older people. As a mature student, Ingrid gained an MSc in Gerontology at the University of Surrey and went on to earn her PhD and to lecture on the Care of Older People at the same University. In 2010 she moved to Germany where she was Senior Research Fellow at the

Institute of Gerontology, University of Vechta, Germany. Today, Ingrid lives her expertise as the daughter and daughter-in-law of nonagenarians and participates in long-term care debates with the World Health Organization. Read more.

"Ageism: A Pervasive and Insidious Health Threat"

The World Health Organization (WHO) is sponsoring four research teams around the world to study the causes and health consequences of ageism, how to combat it, and how best to measure it. Their work will appear in a United Nations report to be published within a year. A preliminary report published in the NY Times, April 26, 2019 by Paula Span entitled "Ageism: A Pervasive and Insidious Health Threat" shows that intergenerational education programs can shift attitudes and reduce ageism.

The Universal Right to Health must include Older People!



It's been 70 years since the Universal Declaration of Human Rights established the right to health of all people everywhere and the World Health Organization was founded. Global Age Watch keeps track of shifts in the four components of the right to health: availability, accessibility, acceptability, and quality. This <u>summary of insights</u> shows the barriers that often exclude older people from health systems and services, and the failure of health systems to keep pace with two global transitions: rapid ageing and expansion of non-communicable diseases affecting older

adults particularly. Fortunately, more attention to the full life course is encouraged by the Sustainable Development Goals in the UN's 2030 plan. The report offers specific guidance for changes needed to realize older people's right to health.

Impact of Climate Change on Older People



Older people with decreased mobility are among those who are most vulnerable and challenged by climate change. Now, we need strategies at every level to educate older people about the risks and strategies like home modification or relocation that mitigate risks. A succinct report from the American Society on Aging that was first published in 2010 provides an overview of climate change and examples of specific health impacts of heat waves, hurricanes, and air pollution.

Adult Immunization



Data, bots and drones: Can technology help increase adult immunization?

This is the title of a follow-up report by ILC-UK to its April 2018 paper on "The Future of Adult Immunisation", a think-piece exploring the potential of technology to influence the delivery and uptake of vaccination. While anti-vaccination sentiments have been reducing immunisation

uptake across the globe, a "fightback" has begun, according to ILC-UK's David Sinclair, with pro-science doctors and healthcare organizations developing a more savvy online presence and better content to respond to the anti-vaccination movement. The report, sponsored by a charitable donation from Sanofi, can be accessed here.

Listening to Loneliness in Ireland - A sympathetic ear is just a call away



Loneliness is a modern epidemic. It contributes to morbidity and can be as dangerous as smoking 20 cigarettes a day, contributing to poor health physically, mentally and emotionally. SeniorLine, Ireland's national confidential listening service for older people (and one of the few worldwide) combats loneliness by being available every day of the year. SeniorLine received over 10,000 calls in 2018, and is recognized by the Irish Department of Health as a primary health care service contributing to older people living independent lives at home.
